

EMT-B CLASS APPLICATION



EMT-B class will meet Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 5-10pm and Saturday from 8am-4pm. This course begins August 19, 2024.

<u>ATTENDANCE</u> is non-negotiable. During this 11 week course, you will only be permitted two weekday absences OR one Saturday. The student is required to make up all information and skills missed during their absence.

APPLICATIONS are due July 19, 2024.

PAYMENT is required in full, prior to August 2, 2024.

REFUNDS will be permitted prior to August 9th. If you choose to drop from the course after that date, a letter must be submitted to the Fire Chief requesting a refund, explaining the reasons why. Refunds will be granted on a case by case situation.

Once an application is received, the student will be given or emailed a Student Handbook. The handbook will explain all the details about the class. The student is expected to read and understand the handbook.

All students must pass a criminal background check and a 10 panel drug screening. Although Marijuana is legal in Illinois, the use is not permitted in the health care field. The drug test must be completed AFTER the start of class. Drug test prior to August 19th will not be accepted.

GRADES: Students must pass the modular exams with a 75% or higher. If a student gets below on three or more exams he/she will not be able to take the National Exam. The student will have to take the entire course over, without a refund.

<u>CLINICAL TIME</u>: Students are required to complete a minimum of 25 hours of clinical time at an assigned hospital. A flu shot, proof of vaccinations, current two step mantoux TB test or Quantiferon TB Gold Plus. COVID vaccination is recommended, but not required. These are the student's responsibility to obtain.

<u>UNIFORM</u>: Part of the enrollment fee includes the student polo for clinical rotation. Students are required to purchase their own pants, boots, belt, etc. for clinical rotations. Please refer to the student handbook for more information.

BOOKS will be provided for each student. It is expected that the student brings their books to class every day. Students must read the textbook to succeed in this program. Note taking items are also required from the student.

COMPUTER: Students will be required to have a laptop computer to bring to class for research and exams.

COMMUNICATION: Students are encouraged to communicate with their instructors and ask any questions they might have. Students are encouraged to use the "GroupMe" app for communications. A group will be set up with all students to assist with arranging study groups, asking questions, and distributing of information.
